For **Nigerians**, the **Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program (OINP)** provides a **fast-track option** to secure PR, especially under the **Regional Economic Development Immigration (REDI) Pilot Program**.

Step 1: Determine Your Eligibility

Before applying, ensure you meet the requirements for an **OINP PR stream** under the **REDI Pilot Program**. The most common options for Nigerians include:

1.1. Employer Job Offer Streams

V Foreign Worker Stream − For skilled workers with a valid job offer in Ontario.

✓ International Student Stream – For those who have completed a degree in Canada.

✓ In-Demand Skills Stream – For workers in agriculture, construction, and healthcare.

Step 2: Secure a Qualifying Job Offer

A valid job offer from an Ontario-based employer is a key requirement for the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program (OINP) and the Regional Economic Development Initiative (REDI) Pilot. The job must meet specific eligibility criteria, including wage, occupation, and employer requirements.

2.2 Research Employers Hiring in the REDI Pilot Regions

If you are applying under the **Regional Economic Development Initiative (REDI) Pilot**, your job offer must come from an employer in one of the following regions:

- **Lanark County:** Lanark County Job Listings
- Leeds and Grenville: <u>Leeds & Grenville Jobs</u>
- Sarnia-Lambton: Sarnia Lambton Workforce
- **City of Thunder Bay:** Thunder Bay Job Listings

2.3 Ontario Job Offer Requirements

To qualify for the **OINP Employer Job Offer Streams** or **REDI Pilot**, your job offer must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ The job must be full-time (at least 30 hours per week).
- **✓** The job must be permanent (not seasonal or contract-based).
- ✓ Your salary must meet or exceed Ontario's median wage for the role.

- **✓** The employer must have been operating in Ontario for at least three years.
- ✓ If the job is in a regulated profession, you must have the necessary certification.
- **✓** For REDI, the employer must be located in one of the designated regions.

2.4 Customize Your Resume & Cover Letter for Canadian Employers

- Resume Tips for Canadian Employers:
- **Use a professional resume format** (maximum two pages).
- **✓** Highlight relevant work experience and achievements.
- ✓ Include a summary statement outlining your skills and goals.
- Remove personal details (age, gender, marital status).
- **Cover Letter Tips:**
- Address the **employer directly** (use their name if possible).
- Explain why you want to work for their company.
- Showcase how your skills match the job requirements.
- ✓ End with a **call to action** (e.g., "I look forward to discussing my qualifications with you.").

2.7 Confirm the Validity of Your Job Offer

Before accepting a job offer, ensure it **meets immigration requirements**:

- **Full-time and permanent** (at least 1,560 hours per year).
- Competitive wage (must meet or exceed the median wage for the occupation).

- Employer must be located in Ontario (for REDI, in a participating region).
- **Employer must be approved by the Ontario government** (not on the ineligible employer list).
- **Solution** Check Ontario Wage Requirements: Job Bank Wage Report

Step 3: Apply for Provincial Nomination Through OINP

Once you secure a job offer, your employer must first complete their part of the OINP process:

3.1 Employer's Responsibilities

- ✓ Submit an **Employer Form** to OINP.
- ✓ Provide business registration documents to confirm legitimacy.
- ✓ Meet wage and work requirements.
- **Employer Application Guide:** OINP Employer Job Offer Guide

3.2 How to Submit Your OINP Application

- reate an account on the OINP e-Filing Portal.
- **P** Upload required documents, including:
 - Passport
 - Proof of work experience (employment letters)
 - Educational Credential Assessment (ECA)
 - Proof of language proficiency (IELTS/TEF)
 - **Pay the application fee:**
 - \$1,500 CAD (if job is outside the Greater Toronto Area)
 - \$2,000 CAD (if job is inside the Greater Toronto Area)
 - **P** Submit the application and wait for a response.

- **Apply Here:** OINP e-Filing Portal
- ✓ If approved, you will receive a Provincial Nomination Certificate, giving you an extra 600 CRS points!

Step 4: Apply for Permanent Residency (PR) Through Express Entry

Now that you have your **Ontario Nomination**, follow these steps:

- Log into your Express Entry profile and update it with your Nomination Certificate.
- Your CRS score will increase by 600 points, making you a top candidate for the next Express Entry draw.
- **Express Entry Profile Update:** IRCC Express Entry Portal
- ✓ Once you receive an Invitation to Apply (ITA), you have 60 days to submit your PR application.

Step 5: Submit Your PR Application to IRCC

After receiving your ITA, you need to submit your PR application with the following:

- Required Documents:
- ✓ Passport and travel history
- Medical exam results
- ✓ Police clearance certificate
- ✓ Proof of funds (at least \$13,757 CAD for a single applicant)
- ✓ Provincial Nomination Certificate

- ₱ Processing Time: 6–12 months
- 📌 Processing Fee: \$1,365 CAD per applicant
- Submit PR Application: IRCC Express Entry Portal

Step 6: Get Your Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR) & Move to Canada

- **✓** Once IRCC approves your PR application, you will receive:
 - A Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR)
 - A Permanent Resident Visa (if required)

- **№** Book your flight and prepare for settlement in Ontario!
